Notes: To be eligible to vote or to run for office, you must have paid your membership dues (based on the calendar year beginning in January), be age 18+, live in our boundaries, and have attended at least 2 of the last preceding 11 meetings and/or attended Association sponsored events/activities. (Dues are applied to the year they are collected and are considered paid at collection for the remainder of the year and through the regular Association meeting in January of the following year.) Members eligible to vote who are not present at a properly called Association meeting may vote if their absentee vote is received by an officer before the meeting, specifies the decision or election in writing, and is signed by the absent voter (email is fine). Dumpster Days - A free community dumpster will be available on April 6th, June 15th, August 24th and October 5th. The dumpster will be placed at the corner of S Ann and Gough from 9am-Noon (or when full). Please do not bring your junk until the dumpster is present; we cannot guarantee (*cont'd on page 3*)

Cleanups - Feb. 24th and April 6th from 9-11am. Tools and bags will be provided but if possible, bring your own gloves. Meet at Mallory's garage (1931 E Pratt - red doors on S Washington). (Note: No cleanups in March and the April cleanup will start by the dumpster; see above for details.)



Sip & Plant Swap - Celebrate Earth Day and Spring at UFPIA's Sip & Plant Swap and Cycle Tour on April 28th. The event will kickoff with an optional bicycle ride at Noon and will tour some of Baltimore City's hidden green spaces and will end at the UFPIA community garden (1827 E

Pratt). Snacks and beverages (by donation) will be available at the UFPIA garden from 2-4pm.

Bring a plant (indoor or outdoor) to exchange for something else to take home. Plants can be brought in any type of container (such as a cutting in a bottle or with roots in a box or bag, etc.) but be sure to note the name of the plant and what type of care is needed (shade or full sun, frequent watering, etc.).

NOTE: HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE DROP OFF IS CLOSED UNTIL APRIL. BULK TRASH AT MOST LOCATIONS (OR CALL 311). PROOF OF CITY RESIDENCY REQUIRED.

GARBAGE:

ALL TRASH MUST BE IN A CAN WITH A TIGHT FITTING LID - NO LOOSE BAGS. Pickup on Wed. put curbside at 6:00pm+ on Tuesday night. If a holiday, pickup on Sat. (*Tip: If lid is separate, tether it to the can with string or cable tie.*) City ordinance mandates that cans cannot be stored on sidewalks. Up to 96 gallons per building (including multi-units) or up to 5 clear or labeled bags of yard waste (leaves, weeds, and branches up to 4" thick or 3' long). (Note: Rats chew through plastic and love to eat dog poop so be sure to pickup after your pet-and it's the law!)

RECYCLING:


STILL ON BIMONTHLY SCHEDULE (NEXT DATES 2/23, 3/8, 3/22.) NO plastic bags at all (including as a container)! Pickup every other Friday. If a holiday, pickup usually on Sat. Items must be clean and dry. All paper and cardboard and cartons (no napkins and paper towels); metal food and beverage cans (no hangers); glass bottles and jars (no light bulbs, dishes, or window glass); plastic bottles, jugs and jars (no bags, straws, yogurt or carryout containers, rigid plastic utensils, plastic rings, or housings). Polystyrene (Styrofoam) is not accepted - put it in your regular trash.

Recap of Jan. 2024 Community Meeting



The meeting kicked off with dessert provided by the UFPIA as well as Girl Scout cookies for sale. Votes/discussion: 1) Vote for Vice President: Brent Temeng ran unopposed: no nominations from the floor. Motion: To elect Brent Temeng as Vice President to continue the remainder of the term; motion passed by acclamation. 2) Vote on proposed 2024 budget: Nancy Hoffmann, UFPIA Treasurer, presented the proposed budget for 2024. The proposed budget was written to spend \$3,000 more than expected income; however, this does include anticipated income and there is enough in the bank to cover any potential overspending. There will be a separate line item for the Lady Day Way (Billie Holiday) enhancements and the Traffic & Parking Committee's total budget was changed to \$500. The possibility of raising membership fees was discussed but some were opposed to this since our membership total is low and the Association should be as accessible as possible to everyone. All committees were encouraged to under-spend and/or do more fund-raising. Motion: To approve the proposed 2024 budget with noted modifications; motion passed.

Discussion: Several available grants were discussed. 1) The Community Health and Safety Works Grant: Funds up to \$100K are available for collaborations that: a) engage artists and designers to create lovable spaces for community use; b) eliminate predatory and unhealthy practices such as illegal dumping, litter and traffic hazards and other conditions; c) remove illegal and dangerous activities from communities by using lighting and camera surveillance strategies and related community safety services. Also grants up to \$250K are available for place-based comprehensive outreach and case management services that directly connect at-risk individuals to safe, restorative pathways. 2) The Johns Hopkins Neighborhood Fund: Grants up to \$15k are available and would include community revitalization, education, employment, health and public safety. Contact Ben for more info.

Officer Reports:

Treasurer: 1) Reminder to pay your membership dues and if possible to pay via check or cash to avoid online fees. If you pay via the PayPal Giving Fund be sure to send a copy of your email confirmation as it takes several weeks to receive notification. 2) If anyone has any experience with taxes. especially since we received a large grant last year, please contact Nancy.

Brainstorming/Committee Reports:

The Committee Chairs reviewed their accomplishments for last year and presented their objectives for this year. Then attendees met with the chairs to discuss items in more detail. New Business:

the time when the dumpster will actually be delivered. NO regular trash or recycles (put them out with the regular curbside pickup). NO tires, appliances, air conditioners, electronics/TVs, propane tanks, hazardous waste (paints, solvents, etc.), construction materials, bricks, soil, or tree limbs. The two parking spaces at the corner of S Ann and Gough will be reserved for the dumpster from Friday at 6pm until Saturday afternoon when the dumpster is picked up so you will not be able to park there or you will be towed. The next bimonthly pickup dates are Feb. 23rd, Mar. 8th and 22nd. Reminder - NO plastic bags or as a container (they contaminate the load).
