#### Safety Update

The State has approved our safety modification/extension request through June 30th and we can also reallocate unspent money from over-budgeted categories.

In addition, our first safety camera monthly access report is now available for February. The report is compiled by the safety chair or another designated member of the special committee. It includes the number of footage requests received, the number of requests approved or denied, camera locations accessed and the dates/ times for which the footage was provided. (The report does not reveal personal information unless the requesting party is a law enforcement agency representative.) (The General Election will be held on Nov. 5th with early voting from Oct. 24th through Oct. 31st.) Register by 5pm on April 23rd. #### <u> Dumpster Days/Cleanup – April 6th</u>

We will be cleaning the streets and a free community dumpster will be available at the corner of S Ann and Gough from 9am-Noon (or when full). Please do not bring your junk until the dumpster is present; we cannot guarantee the time that the dumpster will be delivered. NO regular trash or recycles (put them out with the regular curbside pickup). NO tires, appliances, air conditioners, electronics/ TVs, propane tanks, hazardous waste (paints, solvents, etc.), construction materials, bricks, soil, or tree limbs. The two parking spaces at the corner of S Ann and Gough will be reserved for the dumpster from Friday at 6pm until Saturday afternoon when the dumpster is picked up so you will not be able to park there or you will be towed. #### <u>Sip & Plant Swap and Cycle Tour – April 28th</u>

Celebrate Earth Day and Spring at UFPIA's Sip & Plant Swap and Cycle Tour on April 28th. The event will kickoff with an optional bicycle ride at Noon and will

tour some of Baltimore City's hidden green spaces **SIP 8 PLAN1** and will end at the UPPIA community garden (1827 E Pratt). Snacks and beverages (by donation) will be available at the UFPIA garden from 2-4pm.



Bring a plant (indoor or outdoor) to exchange for something else to take home. Plants can be brought in any type of container (such as a cutting in a bottle or with roots in a box or bag, etc.) but be sure to note the name of the plant and what type of care is needed (shade or full sun, frequent watering, etc.). This is a free event; donations are appreciated. Kids are welcome with an adult but no pets are allowed. #### Weekly Curbside Recycling Is Back

Be sure to secure your items so they are not blowing down the street. NO plastic bags at all or as a container. For acceptable items, see page 2. Also, it is a City violation to store your recycling and trash carts/cans on the sidewalk; they must be stored in the rear of your property or you are subject to a citation.

#### Illegal Dumping Is A Crime

Illegal dumping is the disposing of waste on public or private property without the knowledge or consent of the property owner. This includes littering on streets and alleys. Call 311 for bulk pickup or drop it off yourself (https://publicworks.baltimorecity.gov/solid-waste/dropoff).





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#### NOTE: HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE DROP OFF IS CLOSED UNTIL APRIL. BULK TRASH AT MOST LOCATIONS (OR CALL 311). PROOF OF CITY RESIDENCY REQUIRED.

#### **GARBAGE:**

ALL TRASH MUST BE IN A CAN WITH A TIGHT FITTING LID - NO LOOSE BAGS. Pickup on Wed. put curbside at 6:00pm+ on Tuesday night. If a holiday, pickup on Sat. (Tip: If lid is separate, tether it to the can with string or cable tie.) City ordinance mandates that cans cannot be stored on sidewalks. Up to 96 gallons per building (including multi-units) or up to 5 clear or labeled bags of yard waste (leaves, weeds, and branches up to 4" thick or 3' long). (Note: Rats chew through plastic and love to eat dog poop so be sure to pickup after your pet-and it's the law?)

#### **RECYCLING:**

**BACK ON WEEKLY SCHEDULE! NO plastic** bags at all (including as a container)! Pickup on Friday. If a holiday, pickup usually on Sat. Items must be clean and dry. All paper and cardboard and cartons (no napkins and paper towels); metal food and beverage cans (no hangers); glass bottles and jars (no light bulbs, dishes, or window glass); plastic bottles, jugs and jars (no bags, straws, yogurt or carryout containers, rigid plastic utensils, plastic rings, or housings). Polystyrene (Styrofoam) is not accepted - put it in your regular trash

PLEASE SECURE YOUR ITEMS SO THEY ARE NOT BLOWING DOWN THE STREET! More at: https://publicworks.baltimorecity.gov/recycling-services.

Notes: To be eligible to vote or to run for office, you must have paid your membership dues (based on the calendar year beginning in January), be age 18+, live in our boundaries, and have attended at least 2 of the last preceding 11 meetings and/or attended Association sponsored events/activities. (Dues are applied to the year they are collected and are considered paid at collection for the remainder of the year and through the regular Association meeting in January of the following year.) Members eligible to vote who are not present at a properly called Association meeting may vote if their absentee vote is received by an officer before the meeting, specifies the decision or election in writing, and is signed by the absent voter (email is fine). 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#### Recap of Feb. 2024 Community Meeting

There was no guest speaker.

**Discussion/Vote:** The Mayor's redistricting plan moved all of UFP to District 13. Councilman Cohen is introducing legislation to create a community-driven redistricting process and is asking for community support so elected officials are not controlling redistricting and dividing many neighborhoods. Motion: To support Councilman Cohen's Community Letter for Independent Redistricting; motion passed unanimously.

#### Officer/Committee Reports:

-Beautification: No March cleanup; the next one will be on the April 6th Dumpster Day. -Community Garden: Six new plots were added and now there are 32 gardeners. The waitlist is down to eight people.

**-Fund-raising**: Upcoming events will be a block party with a new Billie Holiday mural unveiling this summer; possibly a family-friendly movie; moving the Regester St. planters with an auction of the signage and a Progressive Dinner in the fall.

-Land-Use: Historical preservation was discussed with Eric Holcomb, CHAP.

**-Safety**: 1) Lights and safety camera installations are underway and several more Memorandum of Understandings (MOU's) have been signed. 2) There have been two incident requests so far (bike theft at Gough and S Ann and a shooting on Bank and S Broadway).


